As announced in December 2009 edition of Mandayam News, Free Computer Training Classes have been started at the Sabha office from 10th Jan 2010. The Sabha has already procured two computer systems and has one already in use. Sri M.A. Parthasarathy, our Web Master has been training nearly 25 senior members, for 2 hours, on every Wednesday. Aided by Power Point presentation and demonstration, the training is liked by one and all. It will definitely be very useful as the 'students' will have hands on experience and be able to send/receive E-mails, browse Internet and learn the basics.

The computer course for elders was concluded on Saturday 27th March 2010. The occasion was marked by a simple valedictory function. The Course Director, Shri. M. A. Parthasarathy was thanked for his excellent services and was presented a memento. All the participants were given a certificate of participation. It is indeed heartening that a very positive feedback has been received about the course from the participants. We share a few excerpts from these feedbacks with our readers:

serious desire to learn coupled with indifferent attendance. However this course presented an entirely different attitude. The participants were highly enthusiastic from the beginning, started attending the classes regularly, some even before the appointed time and bombarded the teacher with lots of questions. All the participants highly appreciated the usefulness of the course and were keen to apply the newly acquired knowledge to their computers.

- The one week gap between the classes gave adequate time to the participants to immediately practice what they had learnt, raise questions in the next class and clear doubts. The recapitulation by the teacher, in order to doubts was extremely useful. This also promoted interaction between the teacher and the participants as also between participants.
- The participants raised a variety of questions according to their individual needs and their own knowledge about computers. The teacher could ably handle these questions with admirable skill and patience.

Dr.S.S.Jayaram is felicitated as the Best Senior Citizen of Malleswaram

The Malleswaram Senior Citizen Forum is a decade old organization. Every year, this organization honours a senior citizen who has contributed to the community at Malleswaram. Dr.S.S.Jayaram was the recipient of this honour for the year 2010, on Sunday 4th April, for his dedicated services as an eminent physician and social worker, to Malleswaram citizens over the last 60 years. This award was not only an honour to Dr.S.S.Jayaram, but also a great pride to the Mandayam community.

Dr.S.S.Jayaram, belonging to Bharadwaja Gotram, hails from the lineage of Mandayam Jayaram Thirumalai Iyengar family. He was born in 1916 in a middleclass intellectual family and his father was a chemistry teacher. Dr. Jayaram is today 95 years old.

His schooling and college education has been extremely impressive, with merit & distinction awards /medals throughout. He passed S.S.L.C in 1930 with distinction in English, obtained 1st rank in Intermediate for the entire Mysore state, and completed his M.B.B.S with merit awards in all the 5 years from the Mysore Medical College. He was awarded the Arumugam Gold Medal and a silk purse for excellence in medicine and Bailey Venkoba Rao Gold Medal for the Best Out-Going Student. Interestingly, he gave away these gold medals to his grand children who are practicing medicine at Toronto and New York, in recognition of their merit.

In 1950, he founded "Bangalore Nursing Home" at Gandhinagar, Bangalore. This institution offered the facilities of in-patient, out-patient, beds, X-ray, orthopaedics, surgery, pathological testing lab and a dispensary. This was one of its kind in medical help in that bygone era. He also had a dispensary near 3rd Cross, on Sampige Road in Malleswaram.

His inherent interest in psychiatry took him to Mc Gill University in Canada, where he obtained a Diploma in Psychiatry and studied further in Cincinnati, U.S.A. He also studied medicine at Edinburgh in Scotland, U.K. He also obtained a Diploma in Psychiatry from A.I.I.M.H (NIMHANS), where he later taught as an Asst. Professor.

His passion and dedication towards psychiatry lead to his becoming the first eminent psychiatrist of

Karnataka; President of the Indian Psychiatric Society for a decade; National President of IPS in 1972; Visiting Professor at Lindberg, Virginia, U.S.A; President of Medico-pastoral Association & Halfway Home; Convener of Suicide Prevention Squad, where in his counselling has saved many lives; and National President of Asha Niketan; apart from being the Founder member of the Royal College of Psychiatry, London and Life Fellow of Indian Psychiatry Society.

He has been a good sports person and has played volleyball, football and hockey in his college days and was the captain of the Basketball team. He has been an active golf player in the last 5 decades and inaugurated the Golf Meet during the Global Mandayam Meet in December 2008, organized by the Mandayam Srivaishnaa Sabha. It is interesting to note that his grandson and great grandson also participated in this meet.

Dr.Jayaram is a voracious reader. He has travelled all over the globe. He has great respect for elders and seniors and made it a point to receive his Degree from his grandfather at the convocation. He is a very sweet person, like a fruit ripened with age. His positive attitude in life has made him always cheerful and there is a touch of innocence on his face. With age his hearing and vision have been dimmed, but he is very alert. In his 20 minute address to the gathering after his felicitation, he spoke of Malleswaram then and now and exhorted the senior citizens to contribute their experience and talent to make our society better. The talk was marked by his good memory and analytical thinking and thrilled the gathering.

Dr. S. S. Jayaram is an ever smiling, 95 years young personality of various facets. It is indeed a matter of great pride to all of us that he was the President of Y.M.M.A and the Mandayam Srivaishnava Sabha. He has 5 daughters, 10 grandchildren and 18 great grandchildren, who dote over him.

Kala Charlu & MITU



Smt. Kala Charlu is the daughter of Dr.S.S.Jayaram. Her daughter, Late Maitreyi Charlu, fondly known as 'Mitu', was a vibrant young lady who in a short span of 26 years had touched the hearts of many and was involved with various social & welfare activities like empowerment of women, helping the underprivileged street children, recycling, animal welfare, water table management and protection of environment, etc.

To continue what 'Mitu' had started, Kala Charlu started the Multiple Initiatives Towards Upliftment (MITU), a Charitable Trust. This foundation is carrying out projects that empower women and supplement the income of the underprivileged, like:

Project Susheel: Trains young girls about hygiene and health; and trains them to make hygienic sanitary towels out of sterile, absorbent, cotton, recycled cloth. A pilot project was conducted in a remote village of Turuvekere Taluk and training programmes have been conducted in many parts of suburban Bangalore. Groups of women have been trained to make these napkins and sell them at a nominal cost of Re.1/- per pad.

Project Sadupayog: To instill the idea of reusing, workshops are being conducted in schools and colleges on making carry bags from newspapers for use in garment / medical shops. Here also a group of women have been trained to make such bags and market them.

IIFM Scholarship: Maitreyi studied at the Indian Institute of Forest Management, Bhopal and won the best out going student award for the year 2002. The Trust has instituted a scholarship at this institution to be presented each year.

Kala is the resource person of this NGO and coordinates all its activities. The foundation was registered in March 2009 and has received the 80 G certificate. Medical camp at Melkote



Mandayam Srivaishnava Sabha and Sri Yathiraja Ramanuja Seva Trust joined hands to conduct a Free Medical camp at Melkote on 13th March 2010. The medical team consisted of Specialists from Karnataka Cancer Society, M.S. Ramiah Dental College, Dr. Ambedkar Eye Hospital, Indian Red Cross Society and St. John's Ambulance Brigade. The Primary Health Care centre was the venue, and the entire hospital was made available for the camp.

An advance team camped at Melkote from the previous day to make all the plans of infrastructure, water, shamiyana, food for all patients, etc. A good publicity



through banners and handbills had been made for nearly a week, in nearly 20 villages near Melkote.

A Medical team comprising of nearly 40 persons participated in the camp and was ably supported by a band of 40 enthusiastic Mandayam volunteers. The turnout of patients was huge and the number of patients who attended the camp was 580. Separate departments had been set up. Apart from the patients who had general health problem, special teams detected diabetes, eye problems, gynaecological and dental problems. There was also a team which advised rural women about personal hygiene, healthcare etc. We also had a section where blood grouping was done and blood donations were collected.

At the end of the day long programme, the results were as under:

- About 45 patients were detected to need Cataract surgery, which has been arranged free of cost.
- The Dentists attended to 65 patients; carried out about 15 extractions and 35 cavity filling.
- About 20 ladies are being tested for cancer detection.

- There were 3 patients who had lung cancer and were advised proper course of treatment.
- About 10 bottles of Blood were collected in the blood donation camp.

The camp was very successful and useful for the rural folk who had come from surrounding villages. All patients were given free medicines.

A condolence meet was held on 1st February 2010 at the Ramanuja Samskriti Bhavana. Many members recalled the services of Shri.R.N.T. We bring you here some excerpts of what they said:

Dwaraki: RNT gave me so much inspiration during 60's. Infact myself and RNT were secretaries to conduct the first All India Floodlit Basket Ball Tournament in 62, which was a grand success. I learnt a lot from him and value his association.

M.K. Narasimhan: RNT was my mama. He was very organized and disciplined and meticulous in what all he did. I got trained under him in working for an organization. Those days we had to go house to house to collect donations. He used to tell me that no matter how many times you are asked to come again by a member, do not loose your temper and go once again. He had made area wise list of members and the names arranged according to the route you had to follow.

M.A.N. Prasad: RNT was my mama too and was very close to us as he stayed with us. When we were school boys, YMMA used to conduct Sri Krishna Jayanthi Celebrations and we – Dwaraki, Narasimha, myself, etc. – used to go to the houses of our community members near by and cart tables, chairs & stools / benches, etc. for the exhibition, in a hand-pulled trolley that RNT used to get. Since the active members of YMMA like Ramu, Babu, MNK and RNT were from our family, we too got involved in the activities of YMMA from an early age. Years later, towards the end of 60's, there was a move to restart the Mandayam meet, which some how could not be held for some years. We had to start by collecting the addresses of all our members. RNT asked me to join him and every evening we went round from house to house in different areas of Bangalore and collected the required details. RNT was very organized & methodical and was a very committed worker. He also had a good sense of humour. It was RNT's suggestion that we do some thing in memory of our grandfather which resulted in our founding the Palahalli Narayana Iyengar Charities.

M.A. Shakuntala: For Seetha and me, who have worked closely with RNT for many years, RNT stands for Reliability, Non-Interference and Timeliness. He was such a pillar of strength to the organization, be it Mandayam Sabha, or YMMA



or YWMA. He, along with Ramu, Babu & MNK, were the four pillars of YMMA who supported us in all our activities under the Ladies' section of YMMA, and later under YWMA.

M.D. Jayasimha: RNT was always conscious of economy and would not waste any thing. In fact, I recall his handing over of the accounts. The details were written on the reverse side of a calendar. His management of the monies of the organization was very good. He was also the treasurer of the State Basket Ball Federation. We request his children who are here to actively associate themselves with the Sabha and continue the good tradition of their noble father.

M.R. Thirunarayan: RNT or Bhaba as we call him at home, had been a great source of strength. More than 50 years ago, he was instrumental for my establishing a business and has helped its growth in the later years. We owe a lot to him.

M.R. Krishna: It was a great pleasure to work with RNT. He was the one to introduce a daily cash book in our accounting. I do hope that this system is being continued currently.

R.N. Harsha: Our father was always disciplined and time conscious. For him every thing was orderly, and planned, whether it was going to office or coming to Sabha, his timings, route, etc were all pre-determined and he would follow it meticulously.

R.N. Pradeep Simha: The involvement in service of my father has flown down to us too. In my own way, I am also involved in social work and community service. I have built a Mandir and we hold satsangs regularly there.

M.D. Ramanuja: Three Thirunarayanans have played a significant role in my life. First is the Lord Thirunarayana of Melukote, the second is M.K. Thiunarayana (Kitchami) who recently passed away and the third is our R.N.T. I have learnt a lot from these three.

From the archives

In this feature, we shall be presenting a profile of some of the illustrious leaders of the Mandayam community who were great achievers and who have left an indelible footprint behind them through the excellence they have achieved or pursued in the midst of tremendous adversity, in diverse areas like scholarship, spirituality, science, service, profession, arts and sports etc. These people have indeed made the community proud. In this feature we shall try to recap their achievements, so that it can act as a motivation and a source of inspiration and pride to all of us, in the community. We shall attempt to feature these legendary figures, broadly in an order, starting from a very early era to the current times. Hence we are starting from nearly a 1000 years back, i.e almost covering a span of a millenium. We earnestly request our members to furnish us information about such persons either from their family or known relatives, who could particularly inspire our younger generation. Kindly provide us the details along with all available supporting documents, and we will be happy to bring out the same.

Swamy Ananthacharya or Anandalvan

Swamy Ananthacharya or Anandalvan was a disciple of Acharya Ramanuja and at his master's behest proceeded to Tirumala to undertake "Pushpakainkaryam" to Lord Venkateshwara at Tirupati. He was one among the 74 Simhasanadhipathis appointed by Sri Ramanujacharya to propagate and spread the philosophy of Vishishtadvaita. There are many legends about Swamy Ananthacharya. The pond that he built to water the flower garden still very much exists there and there is a mantapam built to honour him at Tirumala. The deity from the temple is brought to this mantapam on specified occasions and pooja is conducted commemorating Anandalvan's services to the Lord. Here is a brief profile of Swamy Ananthacharya or Anandalvan.

Swamy Ananthacharya was born in 1053 A.D. at Siruputtur - presently called Kirangur - situated on the banks of Kaveri river, near Srirangapattana of Karnataka. He was the son of Keshavacharya, belonging to Bharadwaja Gotra. He was also known as Anantharya or Anandalvan. He received his education in Shastras from his father and later moved to Srirangam to learn the philosophy of Vishishtadvaita at the sacred feet of Sri Ramanujacharya.

Sri Ramanuja entrusted the new disciples to the care of Dayapala Muni - also known as Arulala Perumal - and requested him to initiate and teach them the tenets of Srivaishnavism. With the passage of time, observing the outstanding genius displayed by Ananthacharya, Dayapala Muni requested him to continue his further education under the direct guidance of Sri Ramanujacharya, himself.

Once, while Ramanujacharya was discoursing on Nammalvar's Tiruvaimozhi, particularly referring to the pasuram "Ozhivil kalamellam" he said that Nammalvar had a burning desire to offer the best of kainkaryams - offering flowers - to Lord Venkateshwara of Tirumala, but could not do so for a variety of reasons. So, Ramanuja asked whether any one of his disciples was ready to go to Tirumala and offer this kainkaryam every day to the Lord without fail. Though hundreds of disciples were present and listening to this impassioned appeal by Ramanuja himself, no one boldly volunteered. It was too well known in those days that Tirumala, being situated in a hostile terrain, was a difficult place to travel to or live in, as it was surrounded by huge forests full of wild life and besides had an unfriendly climate. However as every one watched in disbelief, Ananthacharya stood up boldly and declared that if his Acharya wants him to offer this kainkaryam to the Lord Balaji, he would gladly follow his command and proceed to Tirumala, although this would mean for himself separation from his Guru. Ramanujacharya was greatly pleased and impressed with this spontaneous offer of Ananthacharya and proclaimed to his disciples that here was the only "Aan Pillai" - meaning the only 'man' brave enough to accept the challenge and face the heavy odds and accept the assignment. As Ramanujacharya said in Tamil "Anandalvan taan Aan Pillai". Thus Ananthacharya was called as "Anandanpillai" and all the descendents of Ananthacharya came to be known as Anandanpillais.

Needless to say that Ananthacharya was totally dedicated to his Guru Acharya Ramanuja and Lord Venkateshwara of Tirumala. There are many legends about the incidents in his life at Tirumala, which are illuminating and reveal the close or special relationship he had built with the Venkateshwara temple and the presiding deity Lord Srinivasa, at Tirumala. There are several historical evidences to support these; for example, the inscriptions at the Tirupati temple bearing nos. 171 and 173, mention about Tirunandavanam or flower garden created by Ananthacharya in accordance with the wishes of Ramanujacharya. It also tells about the tank called "Ramanuja Putreri" constructed by him for watering this holy flower garden. Inscriptions bearing nos. 223 and 224 refer to the family name of 'Anandanpillai' in reference to Ananthacharya. This is also corroborated in the report titled "Inscriptions of Devasthanam collection" prepared by Sri Subramanya Shastry.

A crowbar hung at the entrance of the Venkateshwara temple denotes or is in memory of the incident of Lord Sinivasa, who came in the guise of a bramhachari and wanted to share the kainkaryam of digging the tank bed, that was being created to harvest water for the flower garden. But Ananthacharya, not knowing the disguised Lord himself, would not allow any kind of interference in his divine services to the Lord and so chased away the young man. However when the young man appeared too persistent, Ananthacharya got angry and wild and flung the crowbar with which he was digging at the young man, causing him injury. The

camphor applied to the wound on the chin of Lord Venkateshwara, caused by the crowbar, even to this day, is a testimony to this incident, demonstrating his dedication to Lord Balaji's services.

There are many incidents like the above, which highlight the spiritual attainment of Swamy Ananthacharya, who also held the view that the Guru or Acharya, has a more decisive role in one's life than God himself. Besides he was a great social reformer, an ardent devotee with an unflinching faith in following the tenets laid down by his guru, Ramanujacharya and an untiring and dedicated worker, in the cause of spreading Ramanuja's great philosophy. He was a forerunner of our mandayam community, whose descendents settled in four villages near Tirupati known as Ilaya Mandayam, Gajulu Mandayam, Tirumandayam and Chinna Mandayam. However around the end of 14th century, some of their descendants moved out to the present Mandya district of Karnataka, and this lineage has produced some very eminent and outstanding scholars and intellectuals, who have done yeomen service to the Mandayam community. With a missionary's zeal and dedication he ventured out far and wide to spread the noble tenets and practices of Ramanuja's Philosophy and among his other works, may be cited a lyrical hymn, called Mangalashasaka dashakam.

Every year, Anandalvan Thirunakshatram, commemorating his divine birthday falling on Chittirai nakshatram in the tamil month of Chitra, is celebrated at some important Srivaishnavite temples, and in

particular in Melkote, where the presiding deity Shelvapillai, decorated with some of the most beautiful garlands of choicest flowers- a divine theme close to Anandalvar's heart and mission- is taken around the thiruveedhi, to the accompaniment of Nalayira Divya prabhandam chanting, much to the delight of the descendants of Anandalvan and devotees alike. In Kirangoor devotees continue to visit the hallowed site and shrine where Swami Anandalvan was born and offer worshipful prayers even today, to this great apostle of Srivaishnavism. Among many other shrines built in Tamilnadu and elsewhere, to honour and worship, eulogising the divine services of Anandalvan, there stands a prominent one at Shri. Govindarajaswamy temple at Tirupati, where his Tirunakshatram continues to be celebrated year after year, with great devotion. At Tirumala also, on a certain appointed day, the Utsavar of Lord Venkateswara, is ceremoniously brought to the Pushpavanam created by Anandalvan, where worshipful kankaryam is offered to the Lord, amidst chanting of Divya Prabhandam. Thus one of the illustrious forebears of the Mandayam community, and a great savant of the Srivaishnavite philosophy, continues to be revered and honoured even to this day at some of the most notable divine centres in the country.
